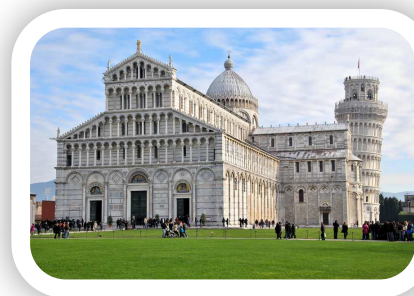

Who can apply?

The Summer School is open to university students and professionals. Students preparing for Italian University enrolment may also apply (min. 18 years old).

Italian Language Courses: levels A1, A2, B1, B2, C1, minimum 15 students (60h Italian Language Course, morning courses).

Social and recreational programme

A range of optional excursions and social events will be offered throughout the summer school. These are likely to include: visits to Lucca, Torre del Lago Puccini including an evening at the theatre, and, finally, some guided tours at some museums in Pisa.

Please note that most of these activities incur additional costs, which are payable by students in Pisa.

Certificates

All students who complete the programme will receive a detailed certificate which lists the educational objectives of the Summer School, activities, number of hours (including Lectures and Special Subject Courses), credits and level achieved.

At the end of any course (Language Course and Special Subject Courses), a student may sit the final exam. By passing the final exam, the student earns 6 CFU/ECTS for the Italian Language Course.

Fees and payments

60h Italian Language Course + 10h seminars: 600 euros

Accommodation

The students' accommodation is not included in the course fee. The Summer School students have the opportunity to book accommodation in Pisa DSU's halls of residence, where regular year students live whilst studying. The prices, types of room and facilities available vary depending on the hall but all are within easy walking distance. Students will only be able to apply for this accommodation option once tuition fees have been paid in full. Students are encouraged to apply for this kind of accommodation at the earliest opportunity to avoid disappointment. Participants who want to find their own lodgings may find it useful to see the list of hotels available on line.
